Commissioner Largent wondered if Ms. Ryder has a better idea what the legislative process looks like to bring this issue to resolution. Bob Lutz said he understands there are two avenues; legislation through the Transportation Committee and the budget process. Any legislative bill would probably occur near the end of the session.

Commissioner Swannack said there is angst in the Transportation Committee about pulling any active/inactive railroad lines and that must be worked out first before anything else is considered and Commissioner Largent concurred.

Commissioner Swannack continued about railroad access easements for landowners adjacent to the rail line. WSDOT says they have no paperwork for these railroad crossing and the landowners are concerned about their access and want to be assured they do in fact have access. Sherry Farr added that the landowners are having to pay a fortune for access to their own property. Lisa Carloye said railbanking and crossings could be made official, however as she understands the landowners could potentially use a trail to answer some of these illegal limbo accesses. If the rail reverts back to the railroad in the future, the railroad would have to honor those crossings and she hoped trail creation solves some of these crossing problems.

Paul Spencer talked about the cost of constructing a trestle for bicycles is less expensive and Commissioner Swannack agreed, but said there must be access for emergency responders and it must be in the design.

Ms. Carloye asked the Board if they have any thoughts or concerns about what Pullman Civic Trust should be doing and Commissioner Largent responded, the legislative process and then funding.
