By not doing anything, the county does not become part of any liability and the other members concurred.

075024 20. Chairman Largent reconvened the meeting and asked if there were any comments before the Board considers adoption of the 2014 budget. It is obvious this budget has been one of the more difficult budgets; revenue driven rather than expense driven and a forward thinking process. The Board has made it clear it is imperative to reach and sustain a long-term sustainable budget and the 2014 budget does not do it on its own. If nothing changes on the revenue side, they will be making additional cuts moving into the 2015-2016 biennial budget as a beginning point for sustainability. It is the intent of the Board to begin the 2015-2016 budget process early in the 2014 calendar year, hence why the EAT Committee asked for the levy lid lift ballot issue to occur in February rather than later in the year, In that way the playing field will be known earlier.

Auditor Coker thanked everyone that worked on the budget process including Cinnamon Brown, Gary Petrovich, the department heads, elected officials and the Board and the commissioners echoed her appreciation.

Commissioner Swannack said unless something changes in 2014 more cuts are coming in the 2015-2016 budget. There is no state or federal information indicating they will cover more for the counties.

075025-075026 21-22. The Chairman asked the Assessor to explain the difference between levying with/without bank capacity. Assessor Reynolds said for 2014 bank capacity would gain the county only \$200 and for that reason he recommended adopting the 2014 levy taxes without bank capacity.

WHEREAS, the estimated expenditures set forth in this budget being necessary to carry on the operations of the government of Whitman County, State of Washington, for fiscal year 2014 and being sufficient to meet the various needs of Whitman County during said fiscal period; and,

WHEREAS, the final budgets for the various departments of the County Current Expense fund and the various Special Revenue Funds, Debt Service Funds, annually appropriated Capital Projects Funds, Enterprise Funds and Internal Services Funds of Whitman County are listed as attached.

3.50.050 Tax collection.

A. Whitman County must contract with the department of revenue for the administration and collection of the excise tax as prescribed in R.C.W. Chapter 82.14B. (Ord. No. 71161, eff. 1-1-2011)

3.50.060 Effective date.

A. The effective date of the tax herein imposed is January 1, 2011, and notice of the tax shall be provided by Whitman County (either directly or via the State Department of Revenue) to all radio communications service companies, local exchange companies and companies providing interconnected voice over internet protocol service at least 60 days in advance of the date on which the first payment is due.

B. The previously authorized excise tax on switched access lines and radio access lines of 50 cents per month shall remain in force through December 31, 2010. (Ord. No. 71161, eff. 1-1-2011)

C. The effective date of the excise tax authorized under 3.50.020(D), shall be January 1, 2014.

3.50.070 Severability.

If any section, subsection, clause, phrase, or word in this chapter or any provision adopted by reference herein is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remaining portions of this chapter or any provision adopted by reference herein. (Ord. No. 71161, eff. 1-1-2011)
